Centre as volunteers until free space was no longer available.

Official Opening of Gander Seniors Resource Centre – coordinator Kim Cheeks. When federal funding ended in 1992, Gander and District Continuing Care Program funded the Centre until the establishment of Health and Community Services Boards. When that funding ended, the Centre closed.



- ➤ Wellness and Healthy Aging Project began included research Home Health Assessment Program for Independently Living Elderly by MUN School of Nursing: Kathryn Hustins, Marilyn Beaton, Lan Gien; plus Cathy Murphy, and Yvonne Jacobs
- Friday Friendship Club Program began. Applied for New Horizon's funding 1991

- ➤ Bereavement Support Group started in June under the Wellness and Healthy Aging program, facilitated by volunteers
- Multi-cultural seniors group -Seniors Bridging Cultures came under SRC umbrella



December 3, 1991 Seniors Resource Centre became Incorporated.

1992

- Donald Peckham elected Board Chair in March. Executive Director Kathryn Avis
- Rosemary Lester became Executive Director



- > Seniors Resource Centre Association was granted charitable status
- ➤ SRC housed Canadian Hard of Hearing Association (CHHA) after they were burned out of their office

- ➤ Interagency Elder Abuse Committee formed later renamed Elder Abuse Committee of Newfoundland and Labrador (EACNL)
- Medication Use Concerns of SRC Clients in Newfoundland (interviews in St. John's and Marystown) - Yvonne Jacobs, Norcen-CAG Internship, 1992. Outcomes - meetings with NL Pharmaceutical Assoc. to encourage development of large print medication fact sheets in plain language (in days before computer printouts); also promoted more education for seniors.

1993

- Kathryn M Morrison, elected Board Chair
- Public Transportation Forum March 30 organized by the Friday Friendship Club - led to the formation of the Seniors Action Committee consisting of volunteer seniors. The committee applied for funding to develop the Seniors Grocery Bus
- April first Friday Friendship Club Newsletter -Senior's Pride printed. Funding from New Horizons
- Foot Care Clinics with Victorian Order of Nurses began at the Centre





> Income Tax Clinics began

Charles Rennie was elected Chair of the Board and served until 2003



- ➤ When federal funding for the three Seniors Resource Centres ended in 1992, each Centre became independent. This led to a name change and new constitution - St. John's Seniors Resource Centre Association Inc.
- Seniors Resource Centre moved upstairs to #214, in the Prince Charles Building
- > First full time fundraiser hired in March, Sylvia Clouston
- ➤ Co-operative Action started, funded by New Horizons, Health Canada start of the Peer Advocate program. Yvonne Jacobs program manager
- ➤ Health Fair for Seniors organized by Cooperative Action for Seniors held in St. John's in October



➤ Funding for **Grocery Bus** project from Venture Program, Health Canada



Seniors Bridging Cultures received grant from New Horizons for an International Cook Book

➤ Emergency Planning for Seniors - coordinated through Co-operative Action. In response to the power outage in December 1994, the SRC invited 28 organizations to discuss concerns. This resulted in the formation of a coalition to address the issue of Emergency Planning for seniors and other vulnerable people.



- Monthly articles contributed to the 50+ New Age Senior newspaper
 continued for 9 years
- Bidgoods provided funding for the Seniors Grocery Bus and Ron Cook's Bus was chartered.



- CAG grant for evaluation of Bereavement Support group.
- Corporate Fundraising Campaign began, coordinated by Reg Gabriel. More than \$70,000 raised over the years.

1996

- Rural Peer Advocate program, funded by Health Canada resulted in the establishment of the first three Peer Advocate groups - in Trepassey, Bell Island and Port au Port.
- > Funding from Health Canada for Friday Friendship Club Elder Abuse Awareness Project which included a Speakers Bureau.

➤ Atlantic Seniors Networking Forum organized by the SRC with funding from New Horizons Partners in Aging Program, Health Canada to celebrate the successes of the two year New Horizons Seniors At Risk program and to lobby for continued funding. (The original New Horizons program 1976 to 1995 had funded seniors' clubs).

1997

- Rural Peer Advocate Program funding from McConnell Family Foundation to expand the program in Central and Eastern NL. Groups formed in Bay Roberts, Clarenville, Grand Falls and Burin.
- Lifelong Learners program, an independent group funded through New Horizons, came under SRC umbrella

First Provincial Peer Advocate Networking Meeting, October 21-23, funded by McConnell Family Foundation. Led to funding by the provincial Department of Health.







- ➤ Aging Well in Rural Places Bonavista, 2001 2002. A Research Project for the Seniors Resource Centre in partnership with the Nova Scotia Centre on Aging & Dalhousie University
- Caregivers Out of Isolation project was established by the Seniors Resource Centre of Newfoundland and Labrador, with a grant from the J.W. McConnell Family Foundation. A province wide program to support unpaid caregivers of family and friends. Led to the development of eight Regional Caregivers Networks across the province.



- ➤ Diabetes Awareness Building on Our Strengths: Knowing What's Good for Me, 2001 2005. Workshops were held across the province to raise awareness. As a result, seniors in 16 communities formed action groups and organized their own active living, healthy eating, and support programs.
- In Support of Shifting Sands recommendations for policy changes to meet the needs of the aging population in Atlantic Canada

- ➤ Listen to Me A project to learn from older adults what they believe are the obstacles they face in the areas of literacy and technology. Funded by the National Literacy Secretariat. Culminated in a Literacy Forum at the Fluvarium where seniors met with policy makers and representatives from businesses and literacy organizations to try to find solutions.
- ➤ Independence through Information Peer Advocacy for Seniors 2002-3 Canadian Rural partnership project. Resulted in recruitment of 37 new Peer Advocates. Of these, 10 joined existing groups in Burin, Grand Falls-Windsor and Trepassey while the rest formed new groups in Botwood, Bonavista and Bishop's Falls
- Falls Prevention Project Upright (2002 -2004) Funded by Veterans Affairs to raise awareness of Veterans and other seniors about prevention and consequences of falls. Senior volunteers across the province organized workshops, performed skits and songs and passed out fact sheets including one on "icers"/creepers.






